Bold Innovative Approach

Violence and violence prevention are currently seen, and reacted to, from a limited, single-layered criminal justice perspective. This narrow law and law-enforcement viewpoint brings us a reactionary, dehumanized solution to a problem that can only be solved with a multidisciplinary, person-centered perspective and approach. Our current system lends itself to words like "evil" for the actions and perpetrators of harm. This has kept us stuck in a "Dark Age - Supernatural" model, devoid of the scientific and technological advancements of the medical paradigm that brought us compassionate, ethical, humane treatment of those suffering with ailments. It is time for violence and violence prevention to be ushered into the modern world by those with an interest to see us move from a punitive model to one characterized by healing, well-being, and dignity.
